



What is iECHO?

iECHO is the web-based, proprietary teleECHO program management software and database developed and managed by the ECHO Institute. The system's purpose is to track the ECHO movement's programmatic activities around the world. The ECHO Institute first developed iECHO to provide a common tool at no-cost to partners - helping lower barriers to participation and supporting the reporting needs of partners. The ECHO Institute continues to enhance iECHO to better suit the needs of partners as we strive toward our collective goal of touching 1 billion lives by 2025.

Due to its key role in tracking the movement, iECHO usage is mandatory for partners conducting Project ECHO activities. Non-exclusive right and license to use iECHO in conducting Project ECHO activities is provided to each partner at no cost per the Project ECHO® Intellectual Property Terms of Use Agreement.

What Administrative Data do Hubs Collect in iECHO?

Each hub is issued its own "instance" of iECHO, in which they manage and track administrative data about their programs- specifically data about:

- When sessions occurred
- Session topics
- Who attended
- Contact information for attendees
- Who presented cases
- Who presented didactics and on what topics
- Documents like agendas and other resources

iECHO is not designed to store Protected Health Information (PHI) and PHI should never be entered into iECHO.
